# **All About Our Day**

## **Primary Objectives**

12a. Recognizes and recalls22b. Measures time and money

## Why It's Important

Preschool children are focused on the present. They begin to learn about time in relation to themselves. By talking with your child about what she did this morning or what she will do this afternoon, she begins to have an awareness of time and sequence.

### **Materials**

Mural or other large paper; painting or drawing supplies

#### What You Do

- 1. Talk with your child about her day. Ask questions that prompt her to think about the various parts of her day. What did you do before you came to school this morning? Do you remember what song we sang in the car on the way to school? What will you do after dinner tonight?
- 2. Allow her time to think and remember as she talks about the day.
- 3. Encourage your child to create mural about her day, drawing pictures to represent each event from morning to night. What did you do first? What happened next? What will you do later?
- 4. When the mural is finished, hang it up so that she can share it with others.
