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As we work through the Roads Study we will be looking at the following

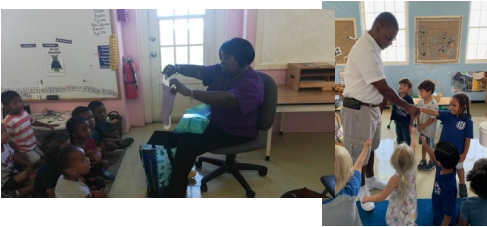
BIG Questions:

What You Can Do at Home

- ◆ Talk with your child about the different types of roads in your area: local roads, dirt roads, alleys.
- ◆ Examine a road or parking lot near your home, What is it made of? What features does it have?
- ◆ Point out interesting features, such as traffic lights, signs, gutters, and crosswalks.
- ◆ Notice the kinds of vehicles that travel on the roads and guess where they may be going.
- ◆ Talk about the jobs of people who build, repair, or work on roads. What equipment do they use? What supplies do you need to make a road?

Reading Logs

Reading aloud to your child can be one of your best parenting experiences! It is also the best way to enrich their vocabulary and get them ready for reading themselves.

In an effort to encourage the love of reading, St. George's Preschool has implemented a **Book-A-Night Program**. Each night your child's teacher will send home a book and a reading log. You may read the book that has been sent or choose from your home reading library. Each night you are asked to record ONE book in your child's reading log. Our goal is to log 150 nights of reading!
